Once at each location, answer the question to prove you found the right location.

In addition to the map, we have included clues to finding the What3words (w3w) location. Ask your accompanying adult to download the free w3w app onto their smart phone, then by solving the clues and typing in the completed words, the app will show you the location within 3 metres.
